Kings County District Attorney Victim Witness Program

• What do we do to help victims? 1) Help them process the trauma. Make time to listen. Validating their feelings. 2) Help them create a safety plan. Help them resolve the uncertainty of the future. 3) Provide a social-support system. Sometimes this is within their family unit, but oftentimes the support system is fragmented. Help restore the pieces to create the social support they need.

• If you think - 'maybe it's domestic violence, maybe it isn't?' - CALL. If you question it, make the call.

- Aime Hernandez (HSA)- Effective September 27th, HSA transitioned to CalSAWS, a new system. Kings County was onboarded as one of the first countries to go live. There have been some hiccups (specifically in regard to the call system) but similar to the system they were on before. Hopefully by 2023, all CA counties will be utilizing the same system. Having more traffic in their lobbies and asking clients to be patient. CalFresh upped the maximum allotment. There are also new amounts for CalFresh. Has a new online system. The new portal will be BenefitsCal. Pandemic EBT is still offered for school-aged children. Trying to get families benefits since unemployment benefits have stopped.
- May Ly (Aetna)- Flu season is here. You can go to any CVS store and get the flu shot. Many CVS pharmacies don't require appointments. CVS surplus still has hand sanitizers left.  - Support with housing and support with moving cost <u>Housing Flex Fund Referral</u> <u>Form</u>
 - Medically tailored meals. For individuals with chronic or disabling mental health/ behavioral health conditions, individuals can be referred to get medically tailored meals delivered to them on a daily basis - <u>Medically Tailor Meals Referral Form</u>
 - Offering transportation to members not only for medical appointments, but also for picking up food and groceries - Members are instructed to call Logisticare at 1-877-931-4755 (TTY 1-866-288-3133) in order to schedule their transportation. Reservation hours: MondayFriday: 7:00 AM -7:00 PM (PST) Bilingual services are available

• Laura Fisher (Kings Tulare Homeless Alliance)- The alliance submitted an Emergency Solutions Grant and did put the Salvation Army to get their full funding (Kings & Tulare) for over \$200,000 (non-competitive) and Kings Gospel Mission (competitive). They are

also in the middle of doing a HUD application and are happy to announce the Rating and Ranking Committee has made the recommendation to fully fund Champions as well as KCAO's HUD programs.

Will be required to do 2022 Unsheltered Point in Time Count (count of number of people experiencing homelessness in our region). Will be happening in January.
