Face of Poverty

Poverty is complex and ever-changing. As a society, we try to wrap our arms around what defines poverty, what poverty looks like, why poverty exists, and how to respond to poverty. A presentation on the Face of Poverty will be provided by Jeff Garner, Executive Director of Kings Community Action Organization (KCAO) to help identify challenges related to poverty in our communities. The presentation will focus on the variations of poverty, the uncommon signs of poverty, and how WE can strive for advocacy before judgement.

KCAO is a private, non-profit organization designated by the Federal Government as the anti-poverty agency for Kings County.

Organization Spotlight: Soup Kitchen

Carole Farris, Soup Kitchen Manager

- Run by all volunteers
- Serving begins at 11:30am but volunteers usually arrive around 9:30am.
- Provide meals Monday- Saturday (9:30-12:30pm; serve from 11:30-12:30pm); sack lunch provided on Sunday (1-3pm; serve from 1:30-2:30pm)
- Receive a lot of food donations; food is used to cook and also to give to people in need
- Receive donations from KCAO; Get deliveries from Panera 2x a week; receive donations from SaveMart every day
- Rely mainly on donations from individuals
- How can you help?
 - Need volunteers
 - Need food
- Volunteers do not need to know how to cook
- To volunteer, please feel free to show up (family, friends, and children allowed). Please show up at 9:30am
- Volunteer schedule is flexible; Soup Kitchen will take anybody, any time, any thing they can give
- In December, did an "adoption" program
- Looking for staff; if someone is looking for a job, please let them know.
 - Looking to serve inside.
 - Positions include security, inventory clerk, staff for potential "adopt" program
- Has teamed up with ValleyVoices and just had a vaccine event

Roundtable

<u>Kings View</u>- Kings View did an event for Pride month. They also have DBT groups on <u>Wednesdays at 5pm</u>. They see a need for homeless assistance. There may be a program starting called Local Initiatives Navigation Center (LINC) on the <u>1st Wednesday of each month beginning July 6th</u> at the Salvation Army. LINC is for all community organizations to come together for homeless services <u>KCAO</u>- Always enrolling in Childcare/HeadStart programs. They are currently recruiting for positions to hire which can be found on the KCAO website (teachers, teacher assistants, family service workers, weatherization workers, etc.)

<u>Devonderia</u>- Provides wellness trainings to organizations. Also acts as Veterans Support Group facilitator. Group meets on the **2nd & 4th Tuesdays of each month from 6-7:30pm**

<u>AmVets</u>- Currently restructuring and reorganizing. Primary focus is suicide prevention, suicide awareness, and homelessness. Will be putting fundraisers together. **Next meeting is July 13th at 6:30pm**. Meeting is located at the Veterans Hall **every 2nd Wednesday**.

Junior AmVets- Need one more child to continue post. If you know of any veterans who have children or grandchildren between the ages of 5 and 17, please let them know of this opportunity Aspiranet parent partner- Go out to clients homes to create relationship between parent and child JTO- Continue to take individuals in adult population. They provide job training and assistance for individuals to complete training (offer technical training and also work experience opportunities). Justice Involved program- any client on state parole or county probation can be referred to JTO. June 22nd from 10-2pm- NAF Lemoore will be having a table regarding open positions JTO has a full career center that they can utilize Mon-Friday (resumes, free typing tests) June 22nd 10-2pm- KCOE will also have information regarding career opportunities Victim Witness Program- Just had an Elder Awareness event yesterday. Doing "Adopt a Senior" this month (through KCWA). If you know of any seniors who need assistance (no age limit; individual agreed upon by KCWA based on their situation), please refer them to the Victim Witness Program (assistance could include hard labor and/or resources needed). You should see purple pinwheels around for Elder Awareness.

KCWA will be starting to plan Domestic Violence Awareness month in October. Please let KPFP know if you are interested in being at the table. KCWA is going to try to pull off the Rock the Purple Luncheon this year. Also thinking of maybe teaching self-help skills this year (how to change a tire, how to change oil).

KCAO- Currently looking for office space; if you know of space please let KCAO know. Doing their summer food program; all information is on KCAO website

KPFP- Office Administrator position is open; please forward through your networks. Position is available on Indeed, LinkedIn, Instagram, Facebook, the KPFP website. Position closes June 23rd with position to be filled in mid-July.
