

Overview


- Tulare-Kings Counties Suicide Prevention Task Force maintains complete data from 2005.
 - Kings County coroner records date back to 1901
- SPTF began suicide prevention activities in 2008.
 - Decreased regional suicide death rates through 2016
 - Large upswing in deaths in 2017

- 2017 saw Kings County's suicide numbers double.
 - California crude rate: 10.94 deaths per 100,000
 - Kings County crude rate: 15.89 deaths per 100,000
- Based on population alone, we would expect Kings
 County to have 1/3 of the number of deaths of Tulare
 County
 - For most age groups, we have 1/2 the deaths
 - For certain age groups, we have equal numbers

Suicide Deaths by Year




Deaths by Gender (2005-2016)



Total number of deaths 2005-2016 = 145

In 2017, 20 males and 4 females died by suicide. Race/ethnicity are not yet available.

Populations of Concern

- Caucasian men, across the lifespan
 - Men ages 50 and older
 - Number of deaths is 3x what we'd expect
 - Men ages 16-35
 - Nearly half of the county's suicide deaths
- Individuals with a history of mental health problems
 - Known motivating factor in 56 deaths
- Hispanic and Latino men
 - Next largest group affected
