What We Are Doing

COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT (CHNA)

KPFP assisted the Hospital Council in gathering information for the 2021 CHNA. KPFP facilitated 5 focus groups and 5 key informant interviews to assist in learning more from service providers in the community about the challenges, barriers and concerns they have regarding health in the county.

MATERNAL WELLNESS COALITION

The California Health Collaborative's Maternal Wellness Coalition is partnering with Kings Partnership in facilitating monthly meetings. With KPFPs support, the coalition will focus on expanding the reach and network of maternal health in the area.

SHELTER REPLACEMENT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Kings Partnership has agreed to assist Kings County Human Services Agency in actively working on promoting Community Engagement projects for Project Roomkey Residents with the ultimate goal of facilitating a positive community perspective on homelessness issues in Kings County.



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Substance Use Prevention (SUP):

Conducted a survey among youth in Corcoran and developed a training for parents.



The Mental Health Taskforce:

Hosted a Suicide Prevention panel and developed a training and campaign focused on mental health.



Healthy Eating/Active Living (HEAL):

Developed a White Paper for School Wellness Policies and hosted an 'Everyday Wellness' panel.



KCWA:

Assisted with planning the events for Victim Right's Week including by facilitating the screening of "California's Forgotten Children".
