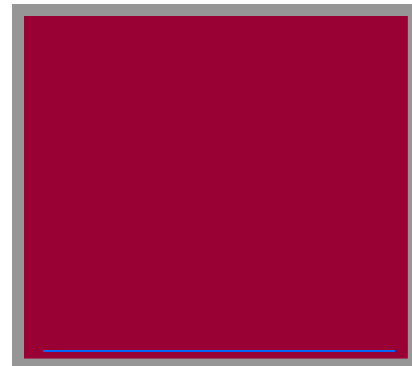

Project Homeless Connect is a one-day, one-stop event designed to provide housing, services, and hospitality in a convenient forum directly to people experiencing homelessness. Now implemented in more than 200 cities coast to coast, Project Homeless Connect is creating change across the country and getting us closer to our mission's goal - an America without homelessness.

How does Project Homeless Connect work?

Individuals, businesses, church groups and social service agencies from Kings and Tulare counties are collaborating to provide simultaneous events in Hanford, Porterville and Visalia that will provide critical information and services to the homeless.
