# **Presentations and Discussion**

- Car Seat Safety Darcy Pickens, Public Health
  - o (HANDOUT)
  - Learn more about adult and child restraints at Pubic Health's Car

    Seat safety classes. Car seat vouchers are also included. The class is open to low income residents in Kings County
  - Fitting Stations for car seat installation are available at Public Health (no appointment needed) and CHP (appointment needed)
  - o Car accidents are the leading cause of death in young children
  - In the class, parents learn about the misuse of car seats (i.e. harness straps are too loose, towels or mats on seat causing improper install), the difference between Best Practice vs. CA Law (i.e. at age 2 rear facing (2017) is becoming a law even though its been recommended before hand), crash forces, vehicle passenger safety systems, practicing installation, and learning the 5-step test before moving onto the seat belts

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- Violator Program when you get ticket for a car seat violation there is the option to take this class and get the ticket fine reduced
- Home-Visitation Debbie Grice, First 5
  - Unmet need in Kings County is 98.9% for home visitation
  - About 5,00 kids are living in poverty in Kings County
  - KCAO has 34 kids; Kettleman City has 20 kids in home visitation. ONLY 54 kids of our 5,000 being met!
  - Early initiation of service helps prevents child abuse, influence the quality of the early childhood environment and it stimulus effect on infant brain development
  - Positive outcomes include: the child being more ready for school, reading by 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, better health for children and other long –term effects like less crime in the family
  - Programs: Early Head Start, Healthy Families America, Nurse- Family Partnership, Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY), Parents as Teachers
  - Kings County would use paraprofessionals, 15:1 case manger to a family
  - Ability to leverage Targets Case Management (funds 50%-60% for the program), ability to partner with Family Resource Centers & other funded programs (would be funded by First 5), ability to leverage health department resources (buildings, other budget units, and staff expertise)
  - Next Steps- Investigating the best practice models (Healthy Families of America, Parents as Teachers, HIPPY)
  - o Kevin Hamilton is someone to talk to from Asthma Coalition about collaboration
