

Reproductive and Sexual Health Workgroup May 3, 2018 from 9:00-10:30am Meeting Notes

- Summary of the work each member organization:
 - California Health Collaborative targets at risk youth teaching them from the Personal Responsibility Education Program with the goal being to promote and improve the sexual and reproductive health of high-need youth populations. They serve youth, ages 10-19, and expectant/parenting female youth up to age 21.
 - Aria Community Health Center is hoping to expand their reproductive health classes. They currently offer individual patient counseling on health issues. They have six clinics: Avenal, Kettleman City, Hanford, Lemoore and Stratford.
 - They see a higher rate of teen pregnancy in Avenal & Kettleman City.
 - Avenal ranks highest in STD cases among adults ages 30-50. Most of these are found during farmworker physicals, many don't seek treatment unless they are required by their employer to have a physical.
 - Champions Recovery Alternative, Inc.
 - Hannah's House has 15 beds for women and children age 5 & under
 - ✓ They integrate mental health in all services
 - ✓ California Health Collaborative educates the women on reproductive/sexual health
 - ✓ Average age of clients is 20-30 years



- Samuel's House
 - ✓ Monica stated that California Health Collaborative is willing to provide reproductive/sexual health education to the men.
- Kings Tulare Right to Life
 - Reaches an average of 100 youth per week at churches
 - KTRL educates using personal testimonies. They have found that people respond much more when there is an emotional reaction.
 - Use data from the World Health Organization
 - Provides community education presentations at fairs, health fairs, churches, schools, etc.
 - After an abortion, women experience PTSD and depression with a 600% higher suicide rate
- Roundtable
 - Jail re-entry program coming soon
 - Health Dept. to hold Foster Youth Health Education for ages 14-21, classes are 1 ½ hour, CA Prep will be teaching in May
 - KPFP Annual Meeting June 21st from 12-2 at Lemoore Civic Auditorium
